1. TITLE:- HEART CONNECT PROGRAMME- Extension Activity at the Old age Home 'Baba Bhaskar Pawar Vrudhashram Trust'

2. OBJECTIVES OF THE PRACTICE:

- To empower students to respond proactively to social concerns
- · To create a sense of social commitment towards marginalized and underprivileged
- · To awaken the sense of social responsibility among students
- To show care to the elderly in the old folks home.
- · To create closer bonds between the old folks and students.
- · To raise awareness and build the heart of passion towards the elderly among students who have participated.
- To sensitize students to social work.
- · To sensitize students to the predicaments and problems of aged people
- To Promote community service for holistic development of the society.

3. THE CONTEXT -

The Contextual features or challenging issues addressed are:

The cultural background of the students and the elderly impacted the dynamics of the visit. Different cultures have varying attitudes and norms regarding aging, respect for the elderly, and social interactions. Sensitivity to cultural differences is essential for fostering meaningful interactions.

- The health conditions of the elderly residents affected their ability to engage in activities and interactions. Some residents had mobility or cognitive challenges, which was taken into consideration while planning the activities
- Language barriers can impact communication between students and the elderly. There were language differences hence, the students found out creative ways to bridge the gap, such as through nonverbal communication or visual aids.
- The generational gap between the students and the elderly residents influenced the nature of their interactions. Students had different interests, hobbies, and communication styles compared to the older generation.
